Community Meeting

Most Fridays from 9.00-9.30 a.m.

All classes, teachers, and parents gather in the Parish Hall for special presentations, celebrations, and other community activities. Children whose birthdays (or half birthdays for students with summer birthdays and near-birthdays for those during holiday breaks) fall during the current week are recognized on stage, and everyone sings.

Montessori Mornings Observation

From November through March, parents can reserve in-person and virtual classroom observations on Thursdays from 9:15 to 9:45 a.m. and 9:45 to 10:15 a.m.

Parents may sign up for the in-person observation via the Parent Portal. A limited number of spots is available each week, and advance registration is required.

United Nations Day

October 24, 10:00 a.m.

The morning begins with class performances related to our cultural studies. The Children's Peace Garden will present a performance including song and music. We are joined by invited representatives from nearby embassies, and there is a special Flag Ceremony during which adult members of the School Community honor their native lands by waving their flags and celebrating their countries. Afterward, visitors may tour the Arbor, Academy, and Ambassador displays, where those students present their cultural work, special projects, and answer questions. CPG classrooms will display arts and crafts related to their continent of study.

Each CPG class needs several chaperones to guide small groups of children to tour the older classes' exhibits. Any parent wishing to visit the exhibits with their own child may sign them out from their teachers.

Festival of Lights

December 19, 6:30 p.m.

Festival of Lights is the culmination of the School's annual curriculum units on World Religions in November and December. For the older students, the evening performance celebrates Spiritual Light and universal teachings of all religions and spiritual paths. In the Children's Peace Garden, the students study one continent each semester, so the performance draws from the cultures and traditions of the continent. The children will perform a song or two to bring their studies to life. In addition, they learn about the unique traditions and similarities of Diwali, Hanukkah, Christmas, and Kwanzaa.

Family Dance

February 20, 7:00 p.m.

The Family Dance, which takes place around Valentine's Day, is an evening event unique to Oneness. It is a fun and exhilarating event for students, parents, faculty, and staff from all grades. Party lights, dance floor, DJ, good times, and more should be expected. Don't miss it!

Science Fair

March 19; Student Viewing 9:30-10:15. Parent Viewing 12:30-1:30 p.m.

As a Manifestation of the skills and knowledge gained during the year, the students engage in science projects in the spring. All CPG students participate in this event, learning about and experiencing the scientific method. The teachers guide class experiments, and all results are displayed at the Science Fair. Older classes' students present and discuss their work, and there are viewing periods open to parents and family.

The Children's Peace Garden will need 8 to 10 chaperones to walk with small groups of children to see the older students' exhibits during Student Viewing, at approximately 9:30-10:15 a.m. Times to be confirmed. (Parent Viewing is available later for upper-grade parents and for CPG parents unable to attend or assist during Student Viewing.)

Earth Day is a celebration of our appreciation for Mother Earth. It often includes performances and other activities that express the students' efforts to become good stewards of the planet. We typically hold a special community meeting, which may include songs, poems, etc., presented by the classes. Families are always welcome to attend.
